Methodology

FoodShare State dollar amount is from Weekly ARRA report of U.S. Department of Agriculture. County estimates were made by assuming the benefit was distributed relative to the number of recipients in each county, averaged over the period April-December 2009.

Economic Recovery Payments County dollar amounts are from the Social Security Administration.

Unemployment Extended Benefits and \$25 Increase State dollar amount is from Recovery.gov. County estimates were made by assuming the benefit was distributed relative to the number of continuing regular and extended benefit claims in each county, averaged from the last week in Feb 2009 through January 2010.

Making Work Pay Credit State dollar amount is from Center on Budget and Policy Priorities estimates based on Department of Treasury outlay estimates. County estimates were made by assuming the benefit was distributed according to each county's share of state employment, as determined by the Bureau of Labor Statistic's Local Area Unemployment Statistics.
