

“What Family Means to Me” College Scholarship Contest

The Wisconsin Council on Children and Families is pleased to announce its 2009 college scholarship contest, “What Family Means to Me.” WCCF will award up to three \$1,000 scholarships that can be used at a two- or four-year college of the recipient’s choice. The contest is open to teens 15 to 17 years old who are:

- * Wisconsin residents;
- * in good standing in high school (enrolled and with a C average or above); and
- * planning to attend a two-year or four-year post-secondary institution.

Participants must submit ONE of the following:

1. A typewritten essay of 650 words or less that describes “What Family Means to Me.”
2. A visual depiction of “What Family Means to Me,” which could include a photograph, a collage, a sculpture, a painting or a drawing.
3. A poem that conveys “What Family Means to Me.”
